

(Pictured Below) Residents enjoyed themselves as they carved and painted pumpkins for Fall Carnival.














He was posthumously promoted to major and received several medals and commendations, including the Purple Heart and Distinguished Flying Cross.

The AZ Wall of Faces Project seeks to locate photographs of all 623 Arizonans killed in the Vietnam War. The photos will become part of a special exhibit in a 7.7 acre The project has opened an exhibit in Suite 1063 just north of Barnes and Noble at the Tempe Marketplace. 








"Welcome Home Veterans Park" in Gilbert will include an 80% scale version of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in Washington, D.C.
